Note 1: Only courses in the 100 level will be accepted, except in Architecture, Fine Arts, Language, and Home Economics.

Note 2: 100 and above courses in various disciplines may require prerequisites.

Note 3: The courses in the following related disciplines are recommended:

Mass Communication (Communication 100, Broadcast Communication 100, Communication Research 101, Journalism 101 and Film 100); Public Administration (PA 11, 108, 111, 121, 141, 151, 161, 191); Home Economics (CT 15, and 25, ID 11, 14, 24, and 20); Tourism (Tourism 110, 113, 114); Geography (100, 131, 135, 173).

NOTE:

As a requirement for graduation, all students must take six (6) units in one of the National Training Service Program (NSTP) components: Civic Welfare Training Service (CWTS), Literacy Training Service (LTS), and Reserved Officers' Training Corps Military Science (ROTC Mil Sci). These are offered by UPD. NSTP 1 & 2 must be taken in the same college.
